
Patient Spotlight

Dental Service Matters



A 2018 CHRT cover Michigan survey revealed that uninsured patients have the most difficulty accessing all types of care. Oral health is important and therefore Cabrini Clinic has made great strides in making these services available. We are now able to provide cleanings, fluoride fillings, X-rays, treatments, & sealants. Your

continued support will allow us to expand these services.

Maternal Support Matters

Project Hope, a program of **Catholic Charities of Southeast Michigan**, has been located within the Cabrini Clinic for over **7 years**. Our Catholic partner program here at the clinic provides safe support and confidential case management assistance to mothers who are pregnant and or parenting



babies up to 12 months of age. As a donation-driven program, we give thanks to all who generously donated to **Project Hope**, be it diapers, pacifiers, or prayers. I am deeply grateful. Our mothers and their babies are very grateful.

I find patients have a hard time understanding and navigating how to find appropriate resources and apply for benefits.

Being able to assist patients has been a huge impact on Cabrini, as I am able to **enroll patients** in HealthCare plans and transfer their care to our sister clinics or a medical office of their choosing, as well as seek out specialists they may need. This allows us to be able to **schedule more patients** who need our services, who are **uninsured and may not qualify for state Medicaid.**

Being able to provide **Basic Needs Resources** has been a huge win for Cabrini. Using a Basic Needs Assessment, I can provide referrals and **social resources**, such as Food Pantries, clothing closets, and utility assistance. Patients have expressed their gratitude for these resources and the positive feedback has been amazing.
